

## Inviting Guest Speakers

There are many people in your community who are knowledgeable about dogs and would love to come speak to your club.

Step 1: Find a resource that is right for your AKC Canine Club and lesson.

It is best to start seeking guest speakers at least 6 weeks in advance.

### 1. Canine Ambassadors

Canine Ambassadors are dog enthusiasts that are registered with American Kennel Club. They visit schools and other youth groups with their dog to teach about a variety of topics, including safety around dogs and responsible dog ownership. ### 2. Clubs

There are many types of clubs associated with American Kennel Club. These clubs are a wealth of dog knowledge and put on dog events in their area. If you would like to invite a judge, handler, groomer, trainer, etc. to speak to your Canine Club, chances are you can find people who fill each of these roles at a club near you.
