

How to Get Started: The AKC ESL Outreach Program

- Contact your local community colleges, community organizations, and churches that offer adult ESL classes. See the Resources for ESL Outreach program that provides links to find local community colleges and churches that offer ESL classes. Please also see the Communication Template for a sample email.
- 2. In your email, supply the links to our AKC ESL lesson plans (insert links here).
- 3. If the organization agrees to have you or your AKC Canine Ambassador visit with a dog, follow up with the organizer two weeks ahead of your scheduled visit (see Communication Template).
- 4. Keep in mind that students who are learning English are coming from a variety of cultures with diverse cultural expectations. Be openminded and patient. Some additional resources about common cultural differences and how to embrace cultural diversity can be found here:

While not all English Language Learners are native Spanish speakers, many are. - 6. Your role is to model how to approach an unfamiliar dog, and to engage in conversation with the students who are learning English. This is a great opportunity to talk about your dog's breed and to share information about your club with members of your community.
