Elections are Coming: Ideas for Identifying Dog-Friendly Candidates

Primary elections across the U.S. are narrowing the list of candidates who will be on the ballot on Election Day, November 3. To preserve the future of purebred dogs, it's important to identify dog-friendly candidates and use your vote to elect those who will protect the rights of responsible dog owners, exhibitors and breeders. Here are four steps that every dog owner should take during the 2020 election cycle.

1. Make sure your voter registration is up-to-date, and consider hosting a voter registration drive at an upcoming dog show or event.
2. Find out where, when, and how to vote -- including absentee and early voting options. Check on current requirements for proof of identity.
3. Become an educated voter – identify and support those candidates who respect your rights as a responsible dog owner.
4. Mark your calendar for the upcoming elections, then get out and vote!

Healthy Pets, Healthy Families

Welcome a new pet into your family is one of the most important commitments you can make. As a dog owner, you want to make sure that your dog will be healthy, and that you have a full understanding of what it takes to care for them. For Americans who get their dogs from responsible breeders, this information is readily available. Similar information is also available for pets from animal shelters and USDA-regulated professional dog breeders.

Sadly, local and state laws that prohibit the sale of purpose-bred pets – including Samoyeds – are proliferating and gaps in current import laws are contributing to the importation of dogs from overseas puppy mills and other random sources.

In many cases, a large number of these imports come from China, a country which in 2016 accounted for 44% of imports in the U.S.¹

Congressman Denver Riggleman

Congressman Denver Riggleman never intended to go into politics. But now that he has – and although he claims the great support of his wife Christine and their children – he says his longest cheerleader goes by the name of Lancor.

Growing up in Manassas, Virginia, Rep. Denver Riggleman's love for dogs began with his shepherd/lab mix named Lancor. The two were so close that the Congressman notes "it was like we were all at the same party." Lancor was a constant companion to the young family. From playing with him and his friends to accompanying him to school, Lancor was a true member of the Riggleman family.

Lancor inspired the Congressman's lifelong passion for dogs. His family now has three, a brown Newfoundland (Chewie aka Chewy) and two Samoyeds (Maggie and Lulu), after their Samoyed passed away. The Samoyeds are AKC registered Samoyeds and are bred by breeders in the Northern Virginia area. Legislative Information and Updates

Congress, forty-one states, and the District of Columbia are currently in session. Eighteen states are accepting pre-filed bills for the 2020 legislative session. AKC Government Relations is currently tracking more than 2,280 bills on the federal, state, and local levels. Many of these bills are being carried over from the previous (2019) session. The majority of sessions are commencing within the next week. Below are some highlights of pending canine legislation issues across the country.
