RULES APPLYING TO DOG SHOWS DOG SHOW ENTRIES, CONDITIONS OF DOGS AFFECTING ELIGIBILITY

(To be voted at the September 15, 2020 Delegates Meeting) The AKC Board of Directors approves this amendment

Rule (Bylaw or Regulation) (Line Out) Proposed (Line In)

CHAPTER 11

SECTION 8-A.

The preceding portion of this section is unchanged.

Any dog, that in the opinion of the Event Committee attacks a person or dog at an AKC event resulting in an injury and is believed by that Event Committee to present a hazard to persons or other dogs, shall be disqualified by the Event Committee pursuant to this section, a report shall be filed with the Executive Secretary of The American Kennel Club. The disqualified dog may not again compete at any AKC event nor be on the grounds of an AKC event unless and until, following application for reinstatement by the owner to the American Kennel Club, the owner receives official notification in writing from the AKC that the dog's eligibility has been reinstated.

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Any dog, that in the opinion of the Event Committee attacks a person or dog at an AKC event and is believed by that Event Committee to present a hazard to persons or other dogs, shall be disqualified by the Event Committee pursuant to this section, a report shall be filed with the Executive Secretary of The American Kennel Club. The disqualified dog may not again compete at any AKC event nor be on the grounds of an AKC event unless and until, following application for reinstatement by the owner to the American Kennel Club, the owner receives official notification in writing from the AKC that the dog's eligibility has been reinstated. This amendment was requested by Staff to the Board; the Board unanimously supported this proposal.

This change removes the requirement for an injury to have occurred for an Event Committee to disqualify a dog that has attacked a person or dog at its event, and it believes presents a hazard to persons or other dogs.

DOG AGGRESSION – ACTION BY EVENT COMMITTEE

If an Event Committee becomes aware of any significant act of dog aggression that takes place in association with their event, three (3) members of the Committee <u>must</u> investigate the incident (except in the case of a dog that is disqualified by the judge) and complete this form. No exhibitor complaint is required. The Event Committee submits this form to AKC[®] Event Operations within 72 hours of the incident by either emailing the document as an attachment to <u>eventplans@akc.org</u> or sending a fax to 919-816-4220.

Rules Applying to Dog Shows, Chapter 11, Section 8-A:

Any dog that, in the opinion of the Event Committee, attacks a person or a dog at an AKC event, resulting in an injury, and is believed by that Event Committee to present a hazard to persons or other dogs, shall be disqualified. When the dog is disqualified by the Event Committee pursuant to this section, a report shall be filed with the Executive Secretary of the American Kennel Club[®]. The disqualified dog may not again compete at any AKC event nor be on the grounds of an AKC event unless and until, following application for reinstatement by the owner to the American Kennel Club, the owner receives official notification in writing from the AKC that the dog's eligibility has been reinstated.
